Snow forecast

Updated: 2.40pm Tuesday 18 November 2014

The area of low pressure responsible for today's rain and snow over Austria will drift away eastwards over the next 24 hours, leaving the Alps with a stable and relatively uneventful few days of weather, lasting into (and perhaps beyond) the weekend.

This means lots of dry and quite mild weather for the second half of the week with variable cloud and sunny spells. Indeed after today, the next significant snow is not modelled to arrive before the weekend of 28-30 November - but that is a long way off, so stay tuned with our daily updates...

Detailed forecast:

Austria

The rest of **Tuesday** will be mostly cloudy with showers or longer spells of rain and snow above 1000-1300m. Above 1500m some moderate accumulations are likely in places.

Wednesday will see a few showers (snow 1000m) linger across some northern and north-eastern parts of the Alps. Further west it should become drier and brighter as the day goes on but feeling on the cool side everywhere.

Thursday will be dry with long sunny spells and increasingly mild temperatures.

France

The rest of **Tuesday** will be mostly cloudy with an increasing risk of snow flurries (1200m) in the northern and western Alps. Above 1500m a few more cm of snow is possible here and there, but generally speaking it won't amount to very much. The best of any brightness will be in the far south of the French Alps.


Wednesday and Thursday will be drier, brighter and increasingly mild.

Italy

The rest of **Tuesday** will be mostly dry with variable cloud, thickest in the eastern Italian Alps where the odd shower or flurry (1200m) is still possible. The best of any sunshine will be in the west.

On **Wednesday** a little cloud may linger in the eastern Alps at first but most places should be dry, bright with sunny spells and increasingly mild temperatures.

Thursday should be fine and relatively mild across all of the Italian Alps.

Switzerland

The rest of Tuesday will see some sunny spells in the south but most of the Swiss Alps will be cloudy with a few snow flurries (1200m) in the west later.

Wednesday will see cloudy skies in the far north-eastern Alps breaking up to leave all regions with sunny spells and relatively mild temperatures. Thursday also looks like being fine.

Outlook:

The end of the week and weekend look like being fine and dry with relatively mild (but not excessively) warm temperatures – great news for anyone lucky enough to be out there skiing!
