### **Snow forecast**

Updated: 6.30pm Sunday 22 March 2015

The Alpine weather remains unsettled with further snow in places over the next few days. The heaviest snow is likely between late Tuesday and Thursday, but there is currently a lot of uncertainty over where will do best and how much will fall.

What we do know for sure is that temperatures will be on the cool side for late March, even cold mid-week when snow may fall as low as 500m in some northern parts of the Alps.

In short, winter isn't finished yet...

#### **Detailed snow forecast:**

#### **Austria**

Monday will be dry with plenty of sunshine and freezing levels around 2300m.

It will remain dry on **Tuesday** but with perhaps a little more cloud, especially in the far south where it will become overcast later. Temperatures will drop a little with freezing levels around 2000m.

**Wednesday** will be cloudier with showers and some snow above 1200m or so, but not generally amounting to much.

**Thursday** will see further showers in places, mostly in the northern and western Alps, where the rain/snow limit will lower to 1000m or less.

# France

**Monday** will be mostly dry with plenty of sunshine early in the day, but some cloud building later. Freezing levels will be around 2200m.

**Tuesday** is likely to start dry but showers are likely to break out later, possibly becoming heavier and more persistent as the day goes on. The rain/snow limit will start around 1500m but drop towards evening.


**Wednesday** and **Thursday** will be cold and mostly cloudy, with showers (snow above 600-900m).

## Italy

Monday will be mostly dry with sunny spells but also patchy cloud, especially in the afternoon. Freezing levels will be around 2300m.

Tuesday will start mostly dry but a scattering of showers is likely to break out later in the day (snow above 1600m).

 $\textbf{Wednesday} \ \text{will see further showers, heavier and more persistent in the} \\$ western Italian Alps with snow to under 1000m.

It will remain cool and unsettled on **Thursday** with further snow showers to relatively low levels in places.

# Switzerland

Monday will be mostly dry with some cloud here and there, but also plenty of sunshine and freezing levels close to 2200m.

Tuesday will be cloudier with an increasing risk of showers, especially in the west and south where they may become persistent later in the day. The rain/snow limit will start around 1300-1500m but drop towards evening.

Wednesday will be mostly cloudy with showers or longer periods of snow and a rain/snow limit around 700-900m in the north, 1100-1400m in the south.

It will remain cool and unsettled on **Thursday**, with further showers likely and a rain/snow limit between 500 and 900m.
