Detailed forecast:

Austria

Saturday will be dry in the Austrian Alps, with plenty of sunshine above any low cloud/fog patches. Freezing levels will be between 1500m and 2200m.

It will remain dry on **Sunday**, though there may be more cloud drifting around. Temperatures will be similar to those of Saturday.

 $\bf Monday$ should see wall-to-wall sunshine, at least at altitude, with freezing levels between 1500m and 2300m.

France

On **Saturday**, any early snow showers (1100m) in the border areas between the southern French Alps and Italy will quickly die away. Most places will then brighten up with plenty of sunshine by the afternoon, with freezing levels close to 2000m in most resorts.

Sunday and **Monday** will be mostly sunny above any low cloud/fog patches, with freezing levels between 2300m and 2700m.

Italy

Saturday will see some early flurries (1100m) in the western Italian Alps die out, with sunny spells developing later in the day. Further east it should be sunny from the word go, with freezing levels close to 1800m.

 $\bf Sunday$ and $\bf Monday$ will then be mostly sunny with freezing levels between 1800m and 2600m.

Switzerland

Saturday will see a few early flurries (1100m) die away from the south-western Swiss Alps, with sunny spells then developing. Elsewhere it will be mostly sunny all day with freezing levels close to 2000m.

Sunday and **Monday** will remain mostly sunny above any low level cloud/fog patches, with freezing levels between 2000m and 2500m.

Outlook:

Tuesday will be mostly fine but Wednesday will see the arrival of a new storm from the north-west.

The exact track and potency of this storm is still unclear but it seems likely that the western Alps are most likely to benefit from some moderate falls of snow. Stay tuned!
